COMMUNITY BASED- ORGANIZATION (CBO)

Community-based organization is a private or public institution that provides precise service to specific communities like community health centres, childcare providers, home visiting programs, state domestic violence coalitions, and local domestic violence shelters and programs, Adult protective services programs, homeless services providers, and food banks. Community-based organization is operated by community residents. It serves the interest it has within the community. As they are locally formed, they will only tackle issues within the community.

Since the community-based organization is a non-profit association, any profit earned by its own through fundraising is exempt from paying taxes. Also, the financial crisis is a problem in CBO as fundraising and donations are the only profit it cannot be enough to achieve group goals and develop the community.

Examples include the Foundation (Philippines), Aga Khan Foundation (Switzerland), Sir Ratan Tata Trust (India), the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (United States), and the Ford Foundation (United States).

INTERNATIONAL NGO (NON- GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION)

International NGO is an independent community that is free from government intervention and extends the notion of NGO to an international spectrum. NGO was coined in 1945 in the founding of the United Nation to differentiate between remote organizations and intergovernmental organizations. Numerous international Nongovernmental organizations (NGO) such as Amnesty International, the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, Oxfam International, CARE, Save the Children, and the World Wildlife Fund international organizations. are Other international NGOs, such as Greenpeace and Sierra Club, are big membership organizations.¹²³ It performs the role of supplying local information that is inaccessible to the government.

Since the 1970s the NGOs have increased, particularly at the national and local levels. At the international level, immense numbers of NGOs have been built to deal with problems such as human rights, women's liberties, and environmental conservation. By the 21st century, the number of international NGOs has been boosted by 6000. It has played a vital role in global campaigns by being against slavery, violence against women, the expansion of nuclear weapons, and so on.
